The Special Awards are judged as an entirely separate entity from the show proper and are arranged as a method of promoting B or C list Judges.

IF YOUR DOG IS BEATEN IN THE SPECIAL AWARD CLASS IT IS NOT DEEMED A BEATEN DOG AND IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM CHALLENGING IN THE MAIN SHOW

COVID NOTICE

The Society will ensure to the best of its ability that the event is run to Covid Safe guidelines. It is your responsibility to ensure you comply with national and local restrictions including advice given about non-essential travel in and out of locally affected regions (which must not be ignored) – in the interests of the safety of all participants this may give rise to a short notice refusal of entry at the society's discretion. The Kennel Club will respect the society's exercise of its discretion.

If a competitor, or anyone in their household, has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they should consider whether it is appropriate that they attend the event.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may, at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dogs not included within the title of the society. We can now accept puppies between the ages of **THREE** months as Not for Competition entries. Entries (with full details) may be made on the entry form.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word “dog” includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at championship Shows in Breed Class where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class ie. **Thursday 10th September 2026**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options: -

(1) **WITHDRAWAL**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) **TRANSFER**

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than above the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the day of the show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or three or more first prizes at Open and Championship shows Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not.

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or four or more first prizes at Championship shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for this breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or five or more first prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for this breed.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show.

STUD DOG: For stud dogs and at least two progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the show.

BROOD BITCH: For brood bitches and at least two progeny of which only the progeny must be entered and exhibited in a breed class at the show.

SPECIAL JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding fifteen calendar months of age on the day of the show.

BABY PUPPY CLASS: A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the day of the show. A Best Baby Puppy will be declared but there will be no progression to further competition.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show opens at **9.00am**
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at **10.00am**
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES:** First Entry per dog £18.00. Classes 27 & 28 £4.00 if only entry. All subsequent Entries with the same dog £2.00. Not for Competition £2.00 per dog. Baby Puppy Class and Special Award Classes £1.00 per dog per Class.
Prepaid Catalogues: £3.00 with entries (£3.50 on the day)
6. Prize monies are not on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under **FOUR** calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a puppy, it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show.

11. **BEST IN SHOW** - Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Board under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor.

16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling and whilst at Kennel Club Licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog(s) in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omissions or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel club regulations to refuse any entry.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

18. **Not for Competition:** Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

19. No modification will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible
20. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of regulations by such handler.
21. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel club regulations to refuse any entry.
22. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition or of a savage disposition, the Committee will be empowered to exclude or remove the dog(s) from the show. The dog(s) must not be brought into the show at any time under any circumstances, and if such exclusion takes place, either before or after judging, the entry fee will be forfeited. No animal other than those duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance
23. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing another judge to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
24. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
25. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
26. Please do not obstruct entrances, emergency exits or gangways. Space will be made available for grooming, trolleys and cages.
27. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been logged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency or b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
28. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

TRADE STANDS.

The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

From M1 North - Leave the M1 at junction 24 and join A6 (signposted Loughborough) After approx 4 miles turn left onto the A6006 (signposted Rempstone, Melton Mowbray). Continue on this road for approx. 14 miles and then turn right onto Loughborough Road (signposted Asfordby Village). Take the first Right (Hoby Road). Asfordby Acres Sports Ground will be on your left-hand side.

From M1 South - Leave M1 at junction 21A and join A46 (signposted Leicester, Newark). After approx. 8 miles take the first exit on the roundabout (signposted A46 Newark). Continue on dual carriageway to junction with A6006. Take exit towards Melton Mowbray, Asfordby. After approx. 4 miles turn right onto Loughborough Road (signposted Asfordby Village). Take the first Right (Hoby Road). Asfordby Acres Sports Ground will be on your left-hand side.

From A1 South/North Bound - From Melton Mowbray, travel along the A6006 towards Rempstone, Loughborough. On the A6006 Asfordby by-pass turn left onto Loughborough Road (signposted Asfordby Village). Take the first Right (Hoby Road). Asfordby Acres Sports Ground will be on your left-hand side.
